Jim, Lance, Craig and Mark Meile met with Sanford Pentagon to discuss a possible partnership between Sanford and the <u>President's Bowl Basketball tourney</u> that is held annually in November. Sanford would donate the rental of the Pentagon for a two day tournament and they would also keep all concession sales. The schools will receive the team registration fees (\$150.00/per team) as well as gate fees; we also will pay the referee's and ancillary costs. The projected earnings could be \$12,000 with 60 team tourney; potential of \$16,500 with 80 teams, etc... Admission cost would be \$5 per adult with under 18 free. Winning teams would still get T-shirts. This has been

discussed with WHS and LHS Booster club presidents. There is a verbal approval from the Pentagon and there is another meeting coming up this Wednesday. Once all the details are worked out a contract will need to be signed. Stay tuned as this exciting new partnership emerges.

RHS Booster Treasurer for 2014/2015 school year is Brad Brown and he was present tonight for everyone to meet. 2014-15 Representative meetings: All Activity coaches, directors and Booster representatives are being asked to attend the next couple of meetings to discuss representatives for each activity for the next school year.
