Training Room Equipment: RHS Trainer Scott Roggenbuck provided a Demo on our current 15 year old ultrasound machine versus a new ultrasound machine for our school. He showed how he could help five versus three students at one time, cut down on the time spent with the combination of heat or cold with the ultrasound all in one, plus a new model would have an electrical stimulator and probe unit. Sanford offers a discount and trade in allowing RHS to purchase a new machine for around \$5,130 versus a new machine without discount or trade in would cost around \$6,745.
